



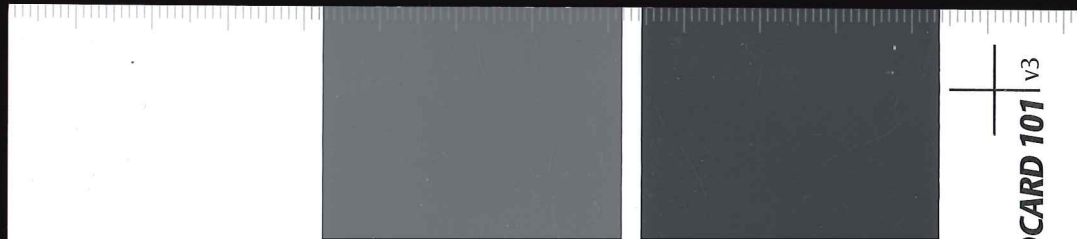

Instructions to Soldier.

1. You will produce this book whenever you require an advance of cash on account, or when instructed to do so.
2. You will give a receipt, on the acquittance roll of the Officer paying you, for all cash advances made to you. The Officer making the payment will sign the corresponding entry in his book on the page for Cash payments.
3. You will make no entries in this book, except on page 16 (Will); and to sign your name on pages 6, 8, and 10.
4. **When you have been placed under orders for active service (and not before)** you may make your will, if you so desire, on page 16.
5. Should you lose your book you will at once report the loss to your Commanding Officer. A new book will be obtained, if possible, from the Paymaster, but it must be understood that no pay can be issued in respect of the period before the date on which you report your loss, until you are finally settled with.

Short Form of Will.

(See instruction 4 on page 1).

If a soldier on active service, or under orders for active service, wishes to make a short will, he may do so on the next page. **It must be entirely in his own handwriting and must be signed by him and dated.** The full names and addresses of the persons whom he desires to benefit, and the sum of money, or the articles of property which he desires to leave to them, must be clearly stated. **The mere entry of the name of an intended legatee on the opposite page without any mention of what the legatee is to receive is of no legal value.**

The following is a specimen of a will leaving all to one person :—

In the event of my death I give the whole of my property and effects to my mother, Mrs. Mary Atkins, 999, High Street, Aldershot.

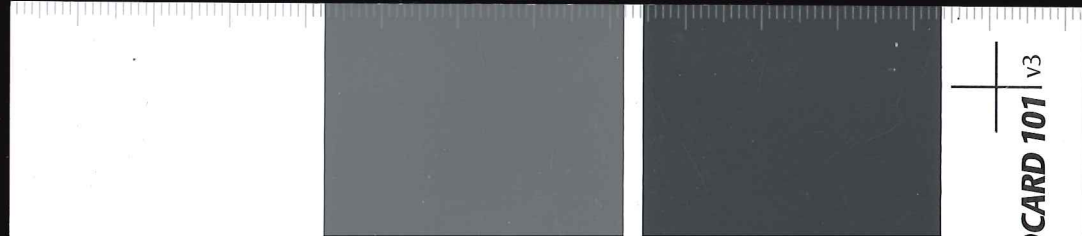
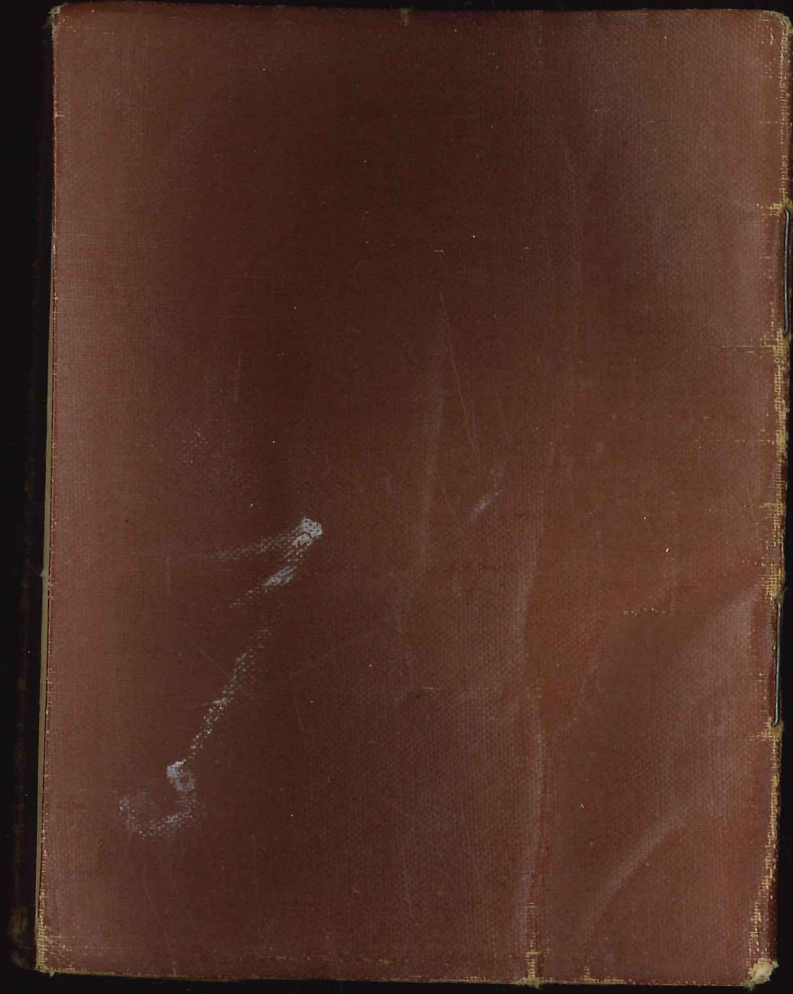

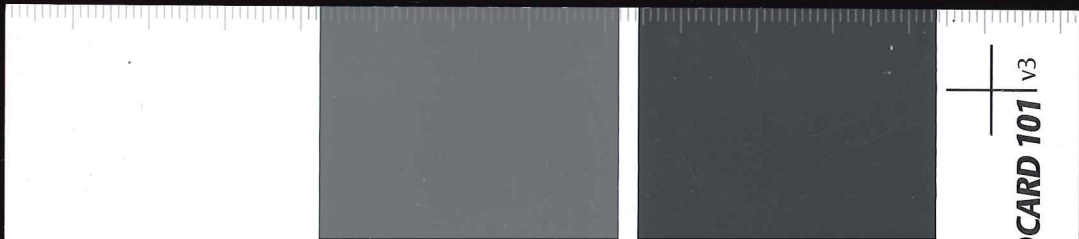

INSTRUCTIONS FOR NEW ZEALAND SOLDIERS ON LEAVE.

It is your duty as a New Zealander to at all times endeavour to maintain the honour and good name of the N.Z. Forces by—

- (1) Appearing in public smartly and correctly dressed.
- (2) Saluting all officers.
- (3) Civility and courtesy to all.
- (4) Conducting yourself as a soldier and gentleman.
- (5) Avoiding drink and immorality.
- (6) Readily showing your pass to the police when called upon to do so.
- (7) Not overstaying your leave.

If you require medical aid you should apply to the nearest military hospital and notify your O.C.

Board and lodging in London can be obtained at the New Zealand Hostel, 17, Russell Square, or the N.Z.Y.M.C.A., Shakespeare Hut, near British Museum.

You are warned against risking infection of Venereal Disease and thereby rendering yourself unfit to serve your country.

Should you, in spite of the above warnings, be so foolish as to risk infection, you must report within 12 hours to the N.Z. Medical Orderly, 17, Russell Square, London, or the nearest military hospital.

Those who contract Venereal will be returned to New Zealand for segregation until cured.
