**MORE MEN FOR TRENTHAM.
ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY LEFT YESTERDAY.
AN ENTHUSIASTIC SEND-OFF.**

A further contingent of men from South Canterbury left Timaru yesterday, en route for the war. There were just on 150 of them.

WAIMATE MEN FAREWELLED.

Once again the residents of Waimate demonstrated their loyalty and patriotism yesterday afternoon, when they turned out by the hundreds to bid farewell to the men of the 9th Reinforcements who were leaving for Trentham. Headed by the local brass band the men were marched through the principal streets to the railway station, where they were met by his Worship the Mayor (Mr Norton Francis), the Mayoress, the Deputy-Mayor (Dr. Hayes), and several members of the patriotic committee.

Addressing the men, Dr. Hayes said that they had answered the call to fight for honour, truth, and justice. The Germans have now found that they have got to fight not only French's "contemptible little army," as they called it, but the whole might of the British Empire. He had confidence in their ability to do their duty as well as their brothers in arms who had gone before them. He trusted it would not be long before the British flag would be flying over Constantinople, and hoped that peace would not be long after. On behalf of the people of Waimate he wished them God speed and a safe return.

Major Francis then addressed the men, saying that he was as one of themselves in that he was on active service, but unfortunately he was destined for work not at the front but here in New Zealand or Samoa. In observing the reinforcement drafts he was pleased to see that Waimate was always well up with its quota. The men were going into camp where they would be put under camp discipline, and he was sure they would find that it was not so bad as some made out. In camp they would be given every opportunity of improving themselves and making themselves more efficient for the defence of their country, for which they were going to the front. He wished them good luck and a safe return.

Three cheers were then given for the men, and one for their mothers.
