LOCAL MEN.

KILLED IN ACTION, AUGUST 7.

The following Timaru and South Canterbury men were killed in action at the Dardanelles on August- 7th:—

Private Thomas Stanley Logan, 24 years of age, was the third son of Mr John Logan, coal dealer, resident in Wilson Street. He was a native of Timaru. He had been employed at: Radcliffe's furniture factory, but .at the time of enlisting he was residing in the North Island, and joined the Fourth Reinforcements. Mr Logan has two other sons serving at the Front, one of them with the Australians.

Evening Star. 30 August 1915 (Papers Past) [07/10/2019]

Mr J. Logan, of Wilson street, Timaru has received word that his son, Private Thomas Stanley Logan, was killed in action on August 7. The late Private Logan, who was 24 years of age, was the third son of Mr Logan. He was a native of Timaru, and received his education at Timaru Main School. At the time of enlisting he was residing in the North Island, and joined the Fourth Reinforcements. Mr Logan has two more sons serving at the front, one of them being with the Australians.

Evening Star. 31 August 1915 (Papers Past) [07/10/2019]

Private Thomas Stanley Logan (Canterbury Battalion, killed) was 24 years of age, and the third son of Mr John Logan, coal dealer, resident in Wilson street, Timaru. He was a native of Timaru. He had been employed at Radcliffe's furniture factory, but at the time of enlisting he was residing in the North Island, and joined the Fourth Reinforcements. Mr Logan has two other sons serving at the front, one of them with the Australians.

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCHES

Private Thomas Stanley Logan, killed in action at the Dardanelles, left with his youngest brother in the Fifth Reinforcements. At Trentham they were transferred to the Fourth Reinforcements, and on arrival at Egypt were detained as garrison until the arrival of the Fifth. Thomas Logan was 26 years of age, and was for a while in the North Island on a bush contract. He played in the Star Football Club.
