The church was prettily decorated with spring flowers by girl friends of the bride, who was given away by her brother, Mr Tom Monteith. She wore a becoming frock of leaf brown georgette with godettes of lace let in the skirt from the knees. The cowl-necked bodice was finished with a diamante clip and her wide tagel straw hat was trimmed with a spray of multicoloured flowers. She carried a bouquet of freesias and primroses.

Miss Mary Monteith, cousin of the bride, was the only bridesmaid, and Mr Herbert Pelvin acted as best man.
