The deceased soldier was buried in a private family grave with his kinsfolk.
 Firing Party, Bugler, and Pall Bearers were supplied by the Guard of Administrative Headquarters, A.I.F. London. The coffin was draped with the Australian Flag. The "Last Post" was sounded at the graveside by an Australian N.C.O.
 Numerous wreaths were placed on the coffin by relatives. An oak cross was erected immediately the grave was filled in.
 The relatives express their warm appreciation of the funeral arrangements.
 Administrative Headquarters A.I.F. London were represented at the funeral.

And I further agree to allot not less than $\frac{2}{5}$ of the pay payable to me from time to time during my service for the support of my wife,* † and children.

 † Two-fifths must be allotted to the wife, and if there are children three-fifths must be allotted.
