William was the son of Mrs Maria Louisa Anderson, of 13 Rose Street, Roslyn, Dunedin, and the late Mr William Anderson. His date of birth was 1/10/1895.

He worked in Fairlie as a carpenter for the firm of Wigley and Jones. He enlisted for service at Trentham on 15<sup>th</sup> December 1915.

He embarked on the 1<sup>st</sup> April 1916 at Wellington, bound for Suez, Egypt where he arrived on the 3<sup>rd</sup> May 1916. He served in Alexandria, and was moved to France arriving in Etaples 6<sup>th</sup> June 1916. The last unit he served with was the Canterbury Infantry Regiment, 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion which he was posed to on the 28<sup>th</sup> July 1916.

He was killed in action on the Somme, France 16<sup>th</sup> Sept 1916.

William is remembered on the Catterpillar Valley War Memorial, the Fairlie War Memorial, and the Memorial Wall in Timaru.
