WELLINGTON.—23rd ultimo, on **military warrant** for being absent from Expeditionary Force without leave, **John Hammond**, age thirty-five, height 5 ft. 7 in., fencer, medium build, fresh complexion, black hair, hazel eyes. He was last employed by W. Polson, station-holder, Wanganui. Next-of-kin, Albert Hammond, father, 130 North Street, Timaru. He is probably identical with **John Hammond**, referred to the *Police Gazette*, 1919, page 501.

In Trentham Camp Orders, it is announced that 72609 Private John Hammond, Headquarters Staff (Quartermaster's Stores), tried by District Court-martial, has been sentenced to imprisonment with hard labour for 180 days for deserting His Majesty's service and losing by neglect his equipment, clothing, and regimental necessaries.
