PERSONAL NOTES.

Corporal Eric Livingstone, killed in action in France on October 3rd, was the youngest son of Mr T. Livingstone, of St. Albans. Corporal Livingstone received his education at the West Christchurch and Boys' High Schools, gaining the cup at West Christchurch in 1914 for the best all-round boy in the school. He was a powerful swimmer, and held many medals for life-saving and swimming. He was also a promising young member of the Canterbury Rowing Club, and a very fine footballer, having played in the B.H.S. first fifteen and for Old Boys. He enlisted on his 20th birthday, sailing with the 35th Reinforcements. He spent his 21st birthday in France, and was killed one month later. Another brother, Lieut. Ruel Livingstone, was killed in Palestine on November 25th, 1917.
