remember he was killed
instantly so he would
not suffer in any way.

The following morning I
took the funeral service
at which there were present
quite a number of the
men; and afterwards we
erected a wooden cross
to his sacred memory.

The grave is situated in the
British Military Cemetery in the
village of Fromcourt not very
far from Beaupre.

This information seems very
meagre but it is indeed
hard to write much
about such a sad subject.

Sept. 18th 1918.

Dear Mrs. Marshall.

I need hardly
say how deeply sorry I
am for the occasion which
necessitates me writing to
you but I do so not only
to express my sincere
sympathy for you in your
sad bereavement but also to
tell you what little I
know relative to your
husband's death.
