Word arrived yesterday that Private Edmund James Dennehy (Ted), second son of Mr and Mrs M. F. Dennehy, North Street, was killed in action at the Dardanelles, on Friday, August 6th. The late Private Dennehy left as a Gunner with the Wellington Battalion, and was spoken of highly in numerous letters from the Front. He was educated at the Marist Brothers school and the Timaru High School, and after a period in the offices of Messrs Perry, Perry and Kinncrney, joined the N.Z. Railways. He was of a bright and amiable disposition and was extremely popular with all with whom he came in contact. In his gun detachment at the Front were two other Timaru lads, Private Scobie, of Kensington, and Private Bloomfield, of Begg and Coy. Messages of sympathy were received yesterday by the deceased's parents from His Excellency the Governor, the Premier, the Hon. W. Massey and the Minister of Defence, the Hon. James Allen. The late Private Dennehy was in his twenty-sixth year.
