He was the youngest I this in the Section and was one of The most popular - a good evedue, chenful, haid worker and as brave as anyon could wish. No words of mine can express how he boys misshin - Malis the hose who are left - and we suffered heavily. Les nodoubt sent you a photo and of hat group only a dozen remain. and they form with me in expressing our heartfelt eympathy in your loss. Jes was Kieled near Hers on the morning of the 16 h while on dury with a Company attacking he energy trenched. About a quarker of a mile from where he fell, in the south western corner of the village of Flers, he lies buried together with a good number of New Lealanders.

he Chaplan of our battation read the service and a rough cross was cricked on his grave by his comrades. This however will be replaced by a putable cross by the military authorities. nothing I can possibly pay Can lighten the awful blow that has feelen but on behalf accept our Accept sympathy The can only hope that in the he proude to Mink that Les lived his life as God had ordained and died for what he considered his duly - The cause for which we are all fighting.
