The only Canterbury name appearing in casualty list No. 721, is that of McLeod, Malcolm A. (Mrs McLeod, Timaru).

Mrs McLeod, Theodocia Street, received a cable yesterday stating that her son, Trooper M. A. McLeod, was dangerously wounded on November 14. Trooper McLeod left Timaru with the Thirteenth Reinforcements.
