The casualty list No. 555 for the Canterbury Military District, published yesterday, is sad reading for people in this district, as it contains the names of a number of local lads who have fallen in the fighting between August 20 and September 7, and the sympathies of all in the district will go out to the bereaved parents and relatives. The following local names appear in the list: Alfred Henderson (Mrs E. Henderson, Orari, mother); Timothy Joseph Brosnahan (Mrs M. Brosnahan, Kerrytown, mother); Edward Jas. Gould, (Mrs Gould, Temuka, mother); Wm. Stanley Morgan (W. Morgan, father).

Private Timothy J. Brosnahan was a son of Mrs Hugh Brosnahan, of Kerrytown, and was 25 years of age. He was born at Kerrytown, and was educated at the school of the Sisters of St. Joseph, Kerrytown. He enlisted, and went away with the 10th Reinforcements. He saw service in Egypt, and was in the firing line practically the whole of the time he was in France.
